TUBE TRAVEL MAKES LONDONERS LESS POLITE

London Underground passengers have had enough of crowded conditions and some are now becoming more aggressive, according to a recent report. Overcrowding has forced many commuters and tourists to forget their usual manners in the rush for seats or standing space. The tube carries 35 million people a day and there are sometimes four travellers per square metre of carriage space during peak hours.

Some commuters just turn up their iPod and go into an "automatic pilot" routine. But worst of all, many Londoners have now lost their habit of giving up their seat to other passengers in need. The report says that people "are going after a seat, ignoring pregnant women and people carrying babies." Members of Transport for London have been asked to give passengers more information about crowding levels on trains, including a traffic light system that could recommend an alternative bus journey or walking route.

"Passengers on overcrowded lines become incredibly focused while running for that seat and it changes how they behave compared to normal life", said a Transport for London spokesman. He also said that they were spending billions of pounds to improve London Underground. That would mean more trains, able to carry more passengers, with faster journeys and larger stations.

*Glossary: crowded = very populated, full of people
commuters = people who travel to work*

CRITERIOS DE EVALUACIÓN Y CALIFICACIÓN

- ◆ Con esta prueba se pretende evaluar la capacidad de comprensión y expresión escrita en inglés.
- ◆ El conjunto de la prueba tendrá un valor máximo de **10 puntos** distribuidos de la siguiente manera:
 - *A. PREGUNTAS DE COMPRENSIÓN 4 puntos.* Evalúan la capacidad de comprensión y de expresión. Las respuestas deben hacer referencia al contenido del texto.
 1. **2 puntos.** Hasta 1 punto por cada respuesta correcta. Se valorará la comprensión del texto con 0,5 puntos y el uso de una adecuada expresión, sin copiar literalmente la respuesta del texto con 0,5 puntos.
 2. **1,5 puntos.** Se calificará cada respuesta correcta con 0,5 puntos. No se concederán puntos si la respuesta es simplemente “verdadero o falso”, sin aportar evidencia del texto.
 3. **0,5 puntos.** Cada respuesta correcta tendrá un valor de 0,25 puntos. No se calificará si se ha marcado más de una opción. Tampoco se descontarán puntos por respuestas incorrectas.
 - *B. PREGUNTAS GRAMATICALES 2 puntos.* Evalúan el uso correcto de estructuras morfológicas y sintácticas. Cada respuesta correcta se calificará con 0,5 puntos. Los errores no significativos no anularán la pregunta, reduciéndose la calificación a 0,25 puntos.
 - *C. EJERCICIO DE VOCABULARIO: 1 punto.* Se otorgará una puntuación de 0,25 por cada respuesta correcta.
 - *D. REDACCIÓN BREVE.* La puntuación máxima es de **3 puntos.** Se evalúa el uso adecuado de elementos de cohesión y la coherencia con el tema propuesto (hasta 1 punto); la madurez en la expresión y la corrección gramatical (hasta 1 punto). La corrección ortográfica y el uso de vocabulario propio sin copiar el texto (hasta 1 punto).
